To be eligible, Scouts must be at least 12 years old or completed the 6th grade and be First Class by July 1, 2010, and his 18th birthday must not be before August 3, 2010. Also, the Scout must be active in his Troop for at least 6 months prior to the Jamboree and be approved by his Scoutmaster and the council. Those who are currently 2nd year Webelos could be eligible!

The 2 Scoutmasters for our Council Jamboree Troops have been selected. We are very proud to announce Mr. Chris Bender, Scoutmaster of Troop 106, Mountain Top, and Mr. Mike Minello, Scoutmaster of Troop 251, Clarks Green will serve as our contingent leaders.

PHILMONT 2009...An Adventure of a Lifetime!

The Northeastern Pennsylvania Council is running a trek to the Boy Scouts of America's premiere National High Adventure Base, Philmont Scout Ranch, in Cimarron, NM, **July 5-21, 2009**. The trek will be a "mountaintop experience" consisting of backpacking and hiking approximately 50 miles of Philmont's 175,000 pristine acres; southwestern touring, and lots of specialized programming along the way.



This trek is open to Scouts from any Troop or Crew who will be 14 years old by January 1, 2009 or 13 years old and completed the 8th grade, and have not yet turned 21 years old. There are a very **limited number of spots** available for this trek: Only 9 or 10 Youth and 2 or 3 Adults may attend. Total **cost** of the trip will be about \$1800. (This cost may vary slightly based on final arrangements and airfare.) Scholarship opportunities exist as well as fundraising programs.

Qualifying Scouts will be accepted on a **first-come basis** with a \$150 non-refundable deposit. Registration forms can be obtained from the Service Center or the Council website. Any adults who wish to attend as contingent leaders should contact Dave at the Service Center as soon as possible.

GREAT MEDICINE NYLT TRAINING: It's Coming...

Great Medicine XVII, the National Youth Leadership Training Conference, is a two-weekend training for youth leaders developed by the Boy Scouts of America and offered by the Northeastern Pennsylvania Council. The conference is an exciting, action-packed program designed to provide youth with 21st century leadership skills and experiences they can use in their home troops and in other situations demanding leadership of self and others. Great Medicine is conducted by a staff of top-level, youth leaders selected by the Council Training Committee.



This year's course will be held at Goose Pond during the weekends of April 24-26 and May 1-3, 2009. Full attendance at both weekends is required. The fee for the conference is \$205. However, if the course fee is paid in full by March 27th, registrants will receive a \$15 discount reducing the total course fee to \$190.

Eligible Scouts must be First Class; be at least 14 years old and have at least begun the 8th grade; currently hold a leadership position in the troop and have the potential and desire to serve as Senior Patrol Leader or Assistant Senior Patrol Leader.
